I am sharing this plea from our Police Department. PLEASE remember to lock your belongings, house, and cars; and remain observant. Just recently, August 4th, officers responded to the 300 block of Ruby for a report of a car burglary. RING Security Camera footage, provided by the victim, shows one of the perpetrators approaching an unlocked vehicle in the driveway with a pistol in his hand. Not only did the offenders enter the victim's car, but they also entered the open attached garage. This incident occurred on a weekday at 5:30am, when many of our residents leave for work or go for a jog. Please consider that when you leave your items unsecure, it invites criminals to come back.



I want to thank the Downtown Design Review Commission for all their comments and direction given on the project as well as Public Works Director, Brendan McLaughlin, to make sure the project looks great. Finally, how about those floral gardens all over town?! Thank you English Garden and our Planting Partners for those patches of beauty.

COVID continues to rip through supply chains impacting all the private developments downtown. Much like our public improvements, it is best to stay positive and watch for progress. Fortunately, we continue to see tons of work happening on projects like the Hamel Dental remodel, the new Tierra Distilling Company, Il Mio (the new Italian Restaurant), 155 Ann Street remodel, the Open Door Tap Room and Bottle Shop, MyCroft Row and soon a complete remodel of the former Ebenezer's Gift Shop. We also expect to see a new development on the corner of Park and Walker Avenues. All this development means a more vibrant downtown and business community that is both a cultural and financial asset to our community.

September also starts budget season for the Village Board and staff. I look forward to approving a budget that makes continued investments in the Village's physical and social capital resources.

## SENIORS CHECK YOUR RATE!

We are asking all Village Seniors (Age 65+) to check their Lakeshore Recycling Systems (LRS) bill to see if you're getting the Senior rate. If not, you will need to complete a senior rate application. Seniors get a \$3.00 per month discount. Regular rate is \$19.15 and Senior rate is \$16.15. Residents are billed quarterly. ## CLARENDON HILLS ELECTRONIC WASTE COLLECTION



Please note that the Clarendon Hills residents will be allowed to place accepted electronic waste items at their curb for collection by LRS if they call **844.NEED.LRS** or submit a request at [LRSrecycles.com/ewaste](http://LRSrecycles.com/ewaste). Residents who don't request and/or enroll for this service may not have items collected. When residents enroll, they are required to list the items for pick-up.

Date of collection is **October 18, 2021.**

This event will take place for **one day only**, and you **must enroll**.

### **ALLOWABLE ITEMS INCLUDE:**

TV's, printers, computers, computer monitors, laptops, gaming consoles, fax machines, scanners, stereo equipment, cell phones, keyboards/mice, extension cords, telephones, cameras, network cables, computer cords.

### **SMALL HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES:**

Blenders, microwaves, toasters, alarm clocks, hair dryers (most small corded items).

### **NOT ACCEPTED:**

Electronics containing liquids/hazardous materials (these items include air conditioners, refrigerators, dehumidifiers, etc.), batteries for cars, boats, sump pumps, etc., smoke detectors, thermostats, lightbulbs, gas-powered items.

If an allowable item is too large to handle, or needs special consideration, LRS may not be able to take it, or reschedule for a different day.

To avoid any confusion, all bagged yard waste (leaves, mixed grass leaves, fall clean up, etc.) shall be picked up at no charge during these months. Simply place out with your other garbage without a sticker.
