Dear Neighbors,

Welcome to Fall! Thank you all for your patience, as the downtown business district undergoes a super cycle of development spurred by the Downtown TIF and public improvements funded predominately by grants. The Open Door Taproom & Bottle Shop opened in October, Hamel Dental is nearly finished, and it looks as though Il Mio, MyCroft Row and Tierra Distillery/Coffee Shop are making great progress. COVID has impacted both public and private development alike, but I am hopeful we will see the first phase of private improvements completed before the winter and a vast majority of the public improvements (including the Metra train station and Burlington Plaza) completed by then as well. A second round is already starting with the remodel of the old Ebenezer's space by the English Garden. By the time the new wildflower plantings bloom this spring, we will have an enhanced community asset for all of us to enjoy.


In recent months, the Village has seen record participation at its board meetings. We always welcome people to be involved in the community and to express their opinions. The Board and I place a lot of weight on what our residents' desire. We are a group of seven volunteers and local residents like yourselves that do our best to set the policy direction and vision for the Village. There are no secret agendas, hidden goals or backdoor politics....everything is fully transparent and accessible for all.

The first issue that seems to have raised the most passion is the discussion of the ladder truck and its possible replacement. Last year, the Village commissioned a study from an outside expert consultant that raised a lot of questions and made recommendations about our fire equipment and operations. The Village Board directed staff to explore some of these options including sharing a ladder truck with one of our neighbors. The Village released a Frequently Asked Questions that can be found on the front page of the Village website at www.clarendonhills.us that addresses the issues more fully. I hope that both sides of the issue can remain civil. Reasonable people can disagree and there is no emergency in any way or form as the current ladder truck is in operation. A decision regarding the truck is expected by year end.

The second issue is a potential gas station on 55th Street at the former Tracy's Tavern site. The developer of this project took the proactive step of meeting with nearby residents in October to give them an opportunity to look at various ideas and provide feedback. The Village Board has not seen any details of any potential project and the Zoning Board has not received any applications to amend zoning. Please allow the process to take its course. If a proposed project requires it, there will be ample time and notice for residents (including posted signs, a mailing to nearby residents, and notice in the newspaper) to provide feedback to both the Zoning Board, possible additional commissions, and ultimately the Village Board.

As we look forward to the next couple of months, I'm excited to say that the Clarendon Hills Chamber of Commerce is bringing back the Christmas Walk. In honor of its 65th anniversary, they are introducing a Holiday market this year. See more about this exciting event in this issue of Trustee Topics and please have a safe and healthy holiday season. We have a lot to be thankful for here in Clarendon Hills.

Christmas Tree Clean Up

Lakeshore Recycling Services (LRS) offers free recycling for Christmas Trees during the month of January. All decorations must be removed. Place trees only for recycling at the curb.



Winter Snow Reminders

Residents are required to park off the Village streets if the weather predicts 2 or more inches of snow fall. This is to allow for proper snow removal. *(It's recommended snow be removed from the top of your vehicle prior to driving!)*

No person shall dump snow onto any public road, public sidewalk or fire hydrant.

Garbage cans should be placed at the end of your driveway and not on the street which includes the concrete ribbons. This makes it easier and safer for our crews to clear the streets of snow and allows cars to go around garbage trucks picking up cans.

No Stickers For YARD WASTE!!!

For the month of November, Lakeshore Recycling Systems (LRS) is providing unlimited collection of yard waste containers without stickers for the purpose of leaf collection. To avoid any confusion, all bagged yard waste (leaves, mixed grass leaves, fall clean up, etc.) shall be picked up at no charge during the rest of November. Simply place out with your other garbage without a sticker.

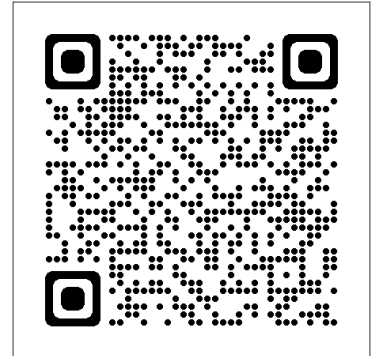
