Maintaining this outstanding level is the culmination of decades of quality decision making by our Village Boards and staff. Finance Director Potempa and her team continue to do an exceptional job digitizing our internal processes and creating new ways for residents to do Village business online/electronically. Our Finance team has excelled in establishing internal controls that protect Village funds, while wearing all the hats still required to meet our legal and financial obligations. As you may be aware, the suburbs continue to see elevated levels of criminal activity, further highlighting our need to stay vigilant about our surroundings. The Village Board recently authorized increasing staff in the Police Department to provide more patrol resources and additional staff time for completing investigations. Additionally the Village joined regional working groups that provide supplementary resources and personnel when needed. Having said that, the Police Department cannot be everywhere at once. The Village is increasing community awareness through publishing the Police Chief's report and broadcasting public safety messaging campaigns. Connect with us here on Facebook: <https://www.facebook.com/VillageofCH>. Residents can help, too. The easiest way to help is to keep your belongings out of sight and lock up your cars at night. Although theft of property from cars is a relatively a minor crime, the simplicity of this crime makes it very attractive to criminals who may then continue on to commit a more serious offense while in town.

Another major topic of conversation at the board level is the Fire Department. We recently established new goals working with Fire Department personnel to move forward with ways to preserve our paid-on-call model, which is by far the most cost-effective model in the region. We also continue the fact gathering process for determining when and what to buy when it comes to replacing the Village's two frontline fire apparatuses (the pumper and the quint with a ladder). Although the process has been slower than many would have liked, we are still on pace to get the equipment ordered, if not delivered, in this calendar year, which is the year in which it was budgeted. In the meantime, we continue to have two apparatuses that are within their service life. The supply chain crisis has hit fire apparatus manufacturers too, which is an additional complication to an already complex subject.

Downtown redevelopment continues progressing. The English Garden Flower Shop started rehabbing the former Ebenezer's space which has been vacant since 2018. They hope to open their new shop doors in late spring/early summer. The Village Board also recently authorized some funding for the Chamber of Commerce to enhance events in the downtown. Our downtown is a hidden gem, and by continuing to create events and grow our businesses, the Village and Chamber hope that people will discover a reason to come back again and again.

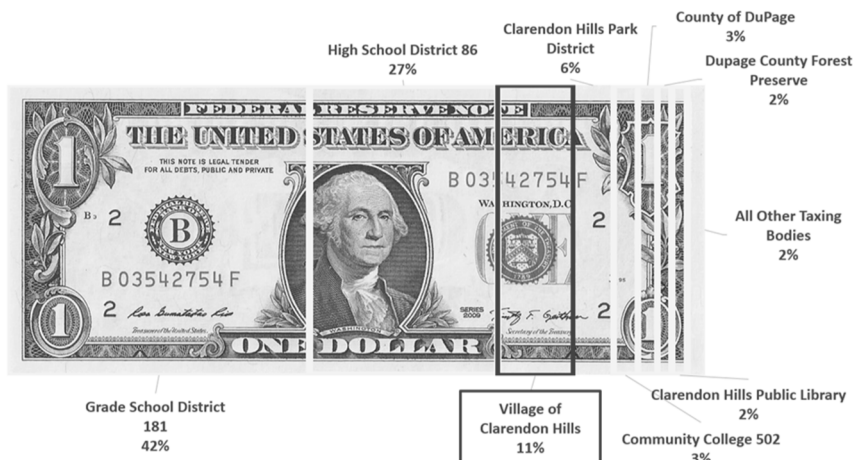

Where Do Your Property Taxes Go?

We hope you find this information helpful in interpreting the actual value and purchasing power of the property taxes you pay. As you can see from the chart, the Village of Clarendon Hills portion of your tax bill is just 11% of a property owner's real estate tax bill that funds the Village's core services. The Village continues to provide outstanding value for your tax dollars by keeping the streets and public areas neat and well maintained, providing police and fire protection, reliable water service and doing these efficiently as possible. As the chart illustrates, the remaining 89% supports the various school districts, park district, DuPage County, and Downers Grove Township, as described below. The Village share from residents within different school districts is about 1% less.



Tax Levy

Property taxation can be confusing. The property taxes you will be paying in 2022 are for what is called the “2021 Tax Levy Year”.

Tax Rate

The tax rate results of from dividing the tax levy by the assessed value and multiplying that number by 100. It is the common factor applied to a property’s billing value to determine the tax contribution. Given the estimated assessed value and the recommended tax levy, the Village’s 2021 tax levy rate (exclusive of the Library) is estimated to be 0.6808, a decrease of 0.0292 from the prior year.

The estimated increase in the Village’s 2021 equalized assessed valuation (EAV) would be the eighth increase since the 2014 levy as the overall EAV declined in levy years 2011 through 2013. The following is a ten-year history of the Village’s tax rates and assessed valuations.

ESTIMATED 2021 LEVY YEAR PROPERTY TAX BILL

Based on an average home value of \$800,000 in Clarendon Hills, taxes paid to the Village in 2022 would be \$1,775. This estimate assumes a residential exemption of \$6,000. Contact the Finance Director, Maureen Potempa at 630-286-5400 if you have questions.

Clarendon Hills residents who are serviced by Lakeshore Recycling Systems (LRS) will be allowed to place accepted electronic waste items at their curb for collection by LRS on Monday, May 2, 2022. **Deadline to register for this one day pick-up is April 28th!**

ALLOWABLE ITEMS INCLUDE:

TV's, printers, computers, computer monitors, laptops, gaming consoles, fax machines, scanners, stereo equipment, cell phones, keyboards/mice, extension cords, telephones, cameras, network cables, computer cords. Blenders, microwaves, toasters, alarm clocks, hair dryers (most small corded items).



*If an allowable item is too large to handle, or needs special consideration, LRS may not be able to take it.

NOT ACCEPTED:

Electronics containing liquids/hazardous materials (these items include air conditioners, refrigerators, dehumidifiers, etc.), batteries for cars, boats, sump pumps, etc., smoke detectors, thermostats, lightbulbs, gas-powered items.
