Message from the President

Dear Friends and Neighbors:

As this is my first message to you as Village President I want to start by telling you how honored I am to have been elected as Village President of this wonderful community. While you are all too numerous to name individually, thank you to everyone who supported me on this journey.

I do not think enough praise can be given to the Village Board members now stepping down. Tom Karaba served this community for almost thirty years, eight as Village President. Tom will be a hard act to follow but I, and the community, am grateful for the foundation he left behind. Paul Pederson has served just as ably for 12 years. Ken Hall stepped up and volunteered to serve his community two years ago when he was needed, and will continue to serve on the Special Events Committee as he has for many years. The Village Board, while providing a steady hand on the rotor through tough economic times, was still able to get much done. It is a testament to their dedication that I step into office not as an agent of change but another volunteer in a long line of volunteers working to make this Village a little better one step at a time.

That is not to say the new Board will not face challenges. The Governor and State continue to threaten to take away income tax revenues that support our Village. These revenues were established more than forty years ago, and represent 12% of our operating budget. It does not take a budgeting expert to realize such cuts would mean a loss of valuable services and costly delays in infrastructure improvements. I urge you to contact your local state representatives to oppose these cuts. I attended an emergency meeting of the DuPage Mayors and Managers on this issue. All DuPage communities are united in opposition to the State of Illinois trying to take away our local tax revenues.

On a more positive note, I am excited to work with and learn from the now senior board members including Paul Flood, Don Knoll and Eric Stach. Along with new trustees Greg Jordan, Carol Jorissen and Don McGarrah, I share a vision for improving the community while sticking to the roots and charm that makes this community unique in the western suburbs. We will continue to ensure your Village government operates in an open and community driven process that reflects our values.

Summer is a great reminder of what makes our community great. In June we all gather as neighbors to enjoy Daisy Days, Dancin' in the Streets and the Daisy Dash. These volunteer driven community events are a great chance to take some time to enjoy our community and help support local businesses. I hope to see you there!

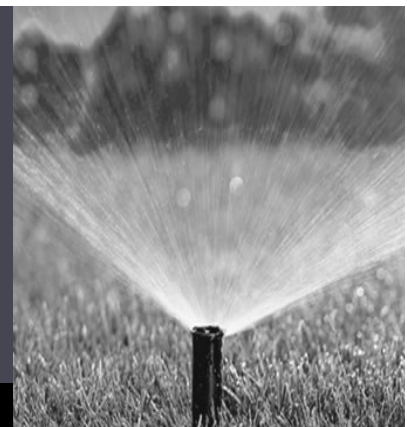
Watering Restrictions

Residents south of the Burlington Railroad tracks may use water outdoors on odd numbered days (June 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, etc). Residents north of the Burlington Railroad tracks may use water outdoors on even numbered days (June 2nd, 4th, 6th, 8th, etc).

No watering is allowed between 1 pm and 4 pm

Please note that watering restrictions apply to lawns, trees, shrubs, and gardens only. Permits for watering newly installed lawns and landscaping are available for a \$25.00 fee payable at the Village Hall.

Lawn Maintenance

Summer brings many residences planning a vacation away from their homes. Please don't forget to make arrangements to have your lawn mowed while away. Lawns reaching the height of 8 inches will be ticketed.

Yard waste collection runs each year April through November. Yard waste is collected on regular refuse days. Yard waste must be placed in biodegradable paper bags or 35 gallon bins clearly labeled "Yard Waste".

Bundles must not exceed two feet in diameter or four feet in length and branches must have diameters of no more than three inches.

Each bag or bundle must have a yard waster sticker, which may be purchased at Village Hall, Clarendon Hills Hardware or Jewel Osco, at the cost of \$2.30 each until July 1, 2015 when the price goes up to \$2.35.

Food and beverages will be available starting at 6:30 pm with music kicking off at 7:00 pm.

GRILLING SAFELY

Grilling hot dogs and burgers, is a welcome sight at the family cookout. But fire elsewhere can make your summer barbeques memorable for all the wrong reasons.

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets a safe distance from the grilling area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup—don't forget to clean the grease catch trays below the grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended.

Charcoal Grilling

- If you use starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add

charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.

- Keep charcoal fluid away from children and heat sources.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing of them into a metal container

Propane Grilling

- Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If you have a leak turn the tank and grill off and have a the grill services by a professional prior to using it. If the leak does not stop after you turn off the tank, call the fire department. Do not move the grill.

Beef, Pork, Veal & Lamb (Steak, chop, roasts)	145°F
Ground Meats	160°F
Ham, fresh or smoked (uncooked)	145°F
Poultry	165°F
