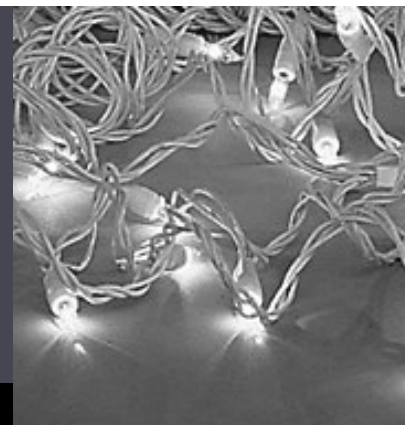


## Holiday Lights No Longer Working?

# Ambulance Fees



On November 16, 2015 the Village Board approved an increase to fees for Ambulance service under the terms of the Village's Intergovernmental Agreement with the Village of Hinsdale for the sharing of Fire and EMS services. These fees are not expected to directly impact residents, because the costs are picked up directly by insurance and Medicare. The fees only reflect expected reimbursement rates from insurance companies, the cost of providing the service is only partially offset by these fees.

## Winter Parking

Residents are required to park off the Village streets if the weather predicts 2 or more inches of snow fall to allow for proper snow removal. No person shall dump snow onto any public road, public sidewalk or fire hydrant.

## 2015 Survey Questions

Late summer of 2015 we polled a random sample of residents regarding what the Village does right and what needs improvement. Part of the survey was an opportunity for residents to leave comments. Here are responses to a few of the concerns that were brought up.



- **Traffic Safety/additional stop signs** - Additional stop signs were added within the Village at the end of 2015, thank you to those who brought up concerns. The Village, however, has a strict policy for new signs, and will only add new signs if determined to be needed by the Village's standards.
- **Additional Train Parking** - More train parking was requested by residents however, not all the parking permits have been issued. - **Downtown development/ new businesses/ keeping existing businesses** - The Village is always working along side the Chamber of Commerce to attract new businesses downtown and to promote the existing ones, but we can only do so much. The key is you, the resident. The more residents eat and shop our businesses on a regular basis, the more successful they become and the more attractive our downtown becomes to new businesses. As an added bonus, successful businesses help to control residential property taxes.

Downtown isn't the only place that holds many of our tax revenue businesses. Located within the Clarendon Hills Village limits are the *Jewel Osco* grocery store on Holmes along with *Country House* and *Tracy's Tavern on 55th Street*; and on Ogden Ave we have the *Infiniti* car dealership (which happens to sell used cars of all makes), *Za Za's* restaurant, *Fuller's Tire Center*, *Sakura Nami Sushi*, *Chicago Clock and Gifts*, *Linly Designs* and *Clarendon Eye Associates*.

- **Balance/Control the Budget** - We are proud to say that we have always had a balanced budget. We publish the budget at the end of every fiscal year and a copy is posted on our web page as well as at the library for the public to view. The Village maintains a AAA bond rating despite major problems with delayed and cut state shared revenues.
- **Leaf pickup should be free** - Leaf pickup is free during the months of October and November, no stickers required.
- **Library, Park District and School Districts Issues:** Many residents listed concerns regarding these independent entities and the concerns mentioned were passed on to them. The Village has no ability to change school district boundary lines.
- **Stormwater and Flooding** is a big concern for some within the community. The Village has been working very hard along side the Park District to find solutions to these concerns. Updated building codes address these issues for new construction over 300 sq feet, and all new public projects contain storm water considerations
