Message from the President

Dear Friends and Neighbors:

There is an old adage that there are two seasons in the Chicagoland region, winter and construction. You may have noticed from the buzz of construction trucks and the lack of snow that we are into the construction season around town. Although this makes traveling through our small town a bit cumbersome at times it is important that we don't let our infrastructure fall behind. It's a win for all of us, with better roads and reliable water mains, our village becomes a more visually appealing community which makes for better home values. The streets under this year's program are the following:

Colfax Ave. (from Richmond to Western)
Ridge Ave. (from Richmond to Western)
Harris Ave. (from Western to Walker)
Ruby St. (from Richmond to Walker)
Western Ave. (from Park down to 56th St.)
Hudson Ave. (from Richmond to Western)
Richmond Ave. (from 55th to Quincy)
56th Street (at Western)

By getting to our streets before they are in complete disrepair, the Village saves large sums of money by only resurfacing instead of having to do a complete reconstruction. We also get the benefit of less wear and tear on our cars from potholes and poor conditions. With the new, attractive shoulder ribbons, no longer will our asphalt crumble on the sides of the road, which will increase their lifespan. That DOES NOT mean that we are resurfacing roads that do not need it. Every year, Village staff does a full evaluation of all roads in the Village to determine which roads are at the end of their optimal life point and need resurfacing. Last year, we were able to roll back certain roads based on this evaluation. This year, the new budget contemplates a slowdown of the road program extending out the replacements by an additional year. This is both due to lower than expected wear on the roads and to lower the construction impact on our residents.

In conjunction with the road program, the Village is tackling the replacement of the 90 year-old water mains underneath the roads, where needed. This allows the Village to avoid tearing up brand new roads to fix water mains. Also by replacing our water mains, we can avoid costly and inconvenient breaks along with meeting increasingly stringent water loss rules established by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. Our mains are still relatively old, but we expect construction to slow with the winding down of the road program as the Village will have replaced a majority of our trouble spots.

On a more exciting note, summer is arriving along with so many events that remind us all how great this community is. In June, we all gather as neighbors to enjoy Daisy Days, the Daisy Dash and the Dancin' in the Street concert series. These volunteer driven community events along with our local businesses are what makes our community unique. I hope to see everyone there!

Watering Restrictions May 15 - September 15

Residents south of the Burlington Railroad tracks may use water outdoors on odd numbered days (June 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, etc). Residents north of the Burlington Railroad tracks may use water outdoors on even numbered days (June 2nd, 4th, 6th, 8th, etc).

No watering is allowed between 10 am and 4 pm

Please note that watering restrictions apply to lawns, trees, shrubs, and gardens only. Permits for watering newly installed lawns and landscaping are available for a \$25.00 fee payable at the Village Hall.

Refuse Pickup on Tuesdays

Starting May 3, 2016, pickup days for resident refuse will be on Tuesdays. The Village will no longer have two separate pickup days for refuse. By having one pickup day the Village saves 2% on the contract which is passed on to the residents. This means rates will not increase in July of 2016 as previously scheduled. In addition to this savings, there will not be weeks where we have three days of refuse trucks driving thru our Village because the amount of yard waste can not be handled in just two days, due to time constraints. An added bonus for some residents is they can go have fun over the weekend and not have to rush home to get the can out for Monday Morning pickup! For others, your can gets picked up a day earlier after a fun filled weekend.

IRS SCAM ALERT

The Clarendon Hills Police Department would like to make our residents aware of a recent scam being reported. If you have questions or want to report any additional scams please contact Sergeant W. Porter at (630) 286-5477.

Scammers make unsolicited calls claiming to be IRS officials. They demand that the victim pay a tax bill. They con victims into sending cash, usually through a prepaid debit card or wire transfer. Scammers often alter caller ID numbers to make it look like the IRS or another agency is calling. They may use the victim's name, address and other personal information to make the call sound official.

The IRS will never:

- Call to demand immediate payment, nor will the agency call about taxes owed without first having mailed you a bill.
- Demand that you pay taxes without giving you the opportunity to question or appeal the amount they say you owe.
- Require you to use a specific payment method for your taxes, such as a prepaid debit card.
- Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- Threaten to bring in local police or other law-enforcement groups to have you arrested for not paying.

If you don't owe taxes, or have no reason to think that you do:

Do not give out any information. Hang up immediately. Call the Police Department.

If you know you owe, or think you may owe tax:

Call the IRS at 800-829-1040. IRS workers can help you.
