Dear Neighbors,

These are trying times. COVID-19 is causing a complete disruption to our everyday life, economy, and our town. Daily, our Village staff and I, are in briefings on this rapidly evolving situation from our local and state health officials. Anything I write here could be out of date within hours so please go to our website and follow the links to information from our health officials.

The Village is taking every step in its power to lower the spread within the community. We coordinated with our schools and park district to shut down congregation areas. We have our public buildings on lockdown, we sent our staff home that is able to work from home, and are utilizing flexible schedules to keep social distancing. Our public safety personnel have been equipped with protective equipment and are taking every precaution to keep themselves healthy and able to serve our residents. The first responders in our public safety departments are always the frontline in a crisis and I am proud of their dedication to our community.

Crisis always brings on new faces that are called on to serve. I want to personally thank the employees at our grocery stores, restaurants, gas stations, essential retailers and the logistics organizations behind those establishments that are putting themselves at a higher risk than the rest of the population to avoid what could be chaos. Although there have been shortages due to hoarding of certain items, I go to our local Jewel store knowing that there will be food there for my family no matter how rough this outbreak progresses.

Many of us in town are blessed with professions that allow us to avoid outside contact. Please follow these steps to lower the spread to help those that cannot, and to help our vulnerable sick and senior population.

- ⇒ Know the signs and symptoms of COVID-19 and what to do if symptomatic:
  - Stay home when you are sick
  - Call your health care provider's office in advance of a visit
  - Limit movement in the community
  - Maintain social distancing of six feet
- ⇒ Know what additional measures those at higher risk and who are vulnerable should take.
- ⇒ Implement steps to prevent illness (e.g., stay home when sick, handwashing, respiratory etiquette, clean frequently touched surfaces daily, wear a mask in public).
- ⇒ Create a household plan of action in case of illness in the household or disruption of daily activities due to COVID-19 in the community.
  - Consider 2-week supply of prescription and over the counter medications, food and other essentials. Know how to get food delivered if possible.
  - Establish ways to communicate with others (e.g., family, friends, and co-workers).
  - Establish plans to telework, what to do about childcare needs, how to adapt to cancellation of events.
- ⇒ Know about emergency operations plans for schools/workplaces of household members.

Certain businesses and their workers are posed to struggle during even a short term disruption. As you may know, Governor Pritzker, to help lower the spread of the disease, shut down all non-essential businesses. That means all hair and beauty professionals, bartenders, hosts and waiters are immediately without work, and our restaurants are out a majority of their revenue. But, like many others that are adapting, all of our restaurants have quickly rolled out delivery and pickup

## Watering Restrictions



Watering Restrictions are enforced from May 15th through September 15th. Residents south of the Burlington Railroad tracks may use water outdoors on odd numbered day (1st, 3rd, 5th, etc.) and Residents north of the Burlington Railroad tracks may use water outdoors on even numbered days (2nd, 4th, 6th, etc.)

### **NO WATERING IS ALLOWED BETWEEN 10 AM AND 4 PM.**

Please note that watering restrictions apply to lawns, trees, shrubs and gardens only.

Permits for watering newly installed lawns and landscaping are available for a \$25.00 fee payable at the Village Hall.

## Required - Vehicle Stickers!

Residents are required to purchase a village sticker for each vehicle they will have housed in Clarendon Hills. The annual license period begins July 1st of each year and ends on June 30th of the next year. **Stickers can be purchased starting May 1st.** Applications will arrive as a separate mailer in May.

New residents must obtain a Village Sticker within 30 days of moving to the Village.

Passenger Car \$40, Motorcycle \$30, and Seniors (62+) 50% off. An additional 50% late fee will be added to stickers purchased after July 31st.

Like last year there is the option of an alternative vehicle sticker. If a resident donates \$10 to support the Dancin' in the Street concert series, on top of a resident's vehicle sticker purchase, they will receive this unique sticker. You must hurry though because there's a limited number of these Dancin' in the Street vehicle stickers. In the event that the concert series is cancelled this year, the donations collected will be put toward a better concert next year.

*At this time Vehicle Stickers can be purchased on-line or via mail. Once reopened you can purchase at Village Hall located at 1 N. Prospect Avenue Monday through Friday from 9am to Noon and 1pm to 5pm and at the Police Station located at 448 Park Avenue, Monday through Friday from 8am to 7pm.*
