## 2018 Road Improvement Program

### Wednesday 9/26

- Brothers Asphalt Paving will be placing the final asphalt surface course on this Wednesday (September 26<sup>th</sup>) through Friday (September 28<sup>th</sup>). We cannot complete the required work if cars are parked along the streets during the work day. Please use your driveway and inform your visitors they cannot be parked along the street during the workday for extended periods. Again, we ask that cars not be parked on the streets that are under construction during the work day, 7:00 AM – 5:00 PM.
- We will post “Fresh Prime” signs along the roads tonight, September 25<sup>th</sup>. **No cars should be parked on the streets overnight. Priming will occur on all streets between 4:00 – 6:00am on Wednesday, September 26<sup>th</sup> to allow it to dry prior to the morning commute. PLEASE DRIVE SLOWLY ON THE PRIMED STREETS SO IT DOES NOT GET ON YOUR CARS.**
- On Wednesday, September 26<sup>th</sup> beginning at 7:00am, Brothers Asphalt Paving will start paving along Oxford doing both the north half and the south half. They will then pave Norfolk from Oxford west to Tuttle. Then they will pave Tuttle doing both the north half and the south half. They will then pave Norfolk from Tuttle to Woodstock. They will then pave Woodstock doing both the north half and south half. Finally they will pave Norfolk from Woodstock to Arthur. This should be the approximate end of the work day on Wednesday.

### Thursday 9/27

- On Thursday, September 27<sup>th</sup> at 7:00am they will pave Arthur doing both the north half and south half. After that they will resume the paving work along Norfolk from Arthur to west of Hiawatha. They will complete each intersection of Norfolk with Indian, Mohawk, Iroquois and Hiawatha as the operations proceeds west along Norfolk.

### Friday 9/28

- It is likely their paving operations will take until Friday September 28<sup>th</sup>. Rainy weather will cause us to suspend operations and resume when the weather is suitable again. The schedule will be pushed back due to rain, but the sequence will remain the same. This sequence will stay the same no matter where the work ends at the end of each work day as well. Our anticipated progress is our best estimate and actual progress can vary.

### General Notes

- At the end of each workday and after your street is finished you will be able to fully use your street and park along the road again. Streets not paved can be used during the evening and overnight hours up to 7:00am. By 7:00am on Thursday and Friday we need the streets not fully paved to be clear of any parked vehicles.
- The paving equipment will make one pass on each street and you **cannot** drive by the paving equipment. We will need up to an hour to finish rolling the newly paved streets so we will need your cooperation while we are working on your street. Barricades, cones and “Road Closed” signs will be posted to **eliminate** the through traffic. This is the final surface so we need to take care and having cars prematurely drive over it can compromise the roads appearance.
- **We ask for your cooperation and understanding during this last critical operation.** This is a moving operation traveling at speeds of 5 mph. Local traffic, school buses and emergency vehicles will need to go around the block to avoid the paving operation during the work day. Residents

needing their cars during the day on streets actively under construction should park along Burlington, at the Park District lots along Norfolk east of Oxford, or on the side streets east or west of that day's planned work areas. You can park on north-south streets once they are paved or in Blackhawk Heights to have access to your cars during the construction day. Vehicles parked along the streets will be contacted by us to be moved and we ask for your understanding and cooperation.

**Your cooperation during construction is greatly appreciated. Typical construction work hours will be 7:00am to 5:00pm on Wednesday through Friday. We need dry weather conditions for our schedule to be met. Rainy days will likely push the schedule back.**
