

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 20-2-1

**EXECUTIVE ORDER REGARDING LIQUOR DELIVERIES
UNDER A DECLARATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY IN
THE VILLAGE OF CLARENDON HILLS, DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

(COVID-19 – 2-1, 2020)

WHEREAS, the Village of Clarendon Hills (the “Village”) is a non-home rule unit of local government, as provided by Article VII, Section 7 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is a dangerous disease which has spread around the world, including in the United States, the State of Illinois and DuPage County; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is a direct and serious threat to the public’s health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, on April 6, 2020, the Village President declared a state of emergency in the Village in Declaration 2020-2, entitled “Declaration of a State of Emergency in the Village of Clarendon Hills, DuPage County, Illinois (COVID-19-2 – April 6, 2020)” (the “Declaration”); and

WHEREAS, the Declaration was made pursuant to authority granted to the Village President in Section 2.6 of the Clarendon Hills Village Code, entitled “Village President’s Authority to Declare a State of Emergency,” and pursuant to Section 11-1-6 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-1-6); and

WHEREAS, the Village President has determined that it is necessary to make this Executive Order to best protect the public’s health, safety and welfare regarding COVID-19;

WHEREAS, On March 19, 2020, the Illinois Liquor Control Commission (the “State Commission”) issued a guidance (the “March 19 Guidance”) indicating that, subject to the approval of a local liquor commission, the State Commission would allow licensees, including those currently approved for on-premises consumption sales only, to conduct packaged sales, “to go” sales, curbside deliveries, home residential deliveries, and any other sale or delivery intended to promote social distancing.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED, by the Village President of the Village of Clarendon Hills, DuPage County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: Incorporation. That the recitals above shall be and are incorporated in this Section 1 as if restated herein.

SECTION 2: Executive Order. That it is ordered as follows:

1. The Village will allow licensees, including those currently approved for on-premises consumption sales only, to conduct packaged sales, "to go" sales, curbside deliveries, home residential deliveries, and any other sale or delivery intended to promote social distancing.
2. Licensees may use third party delivery services to make deliveries.
3. All sales must be in the original container; no delivery of pre-mixed cocktails is allowed. Persons delivering alcohol at curbside or other locations should observe the appearance of the delivery recipient at a safe social distance, and if necessary, require the examination of the recipient identification to ensure the recipient is over twenty-one.

SECTION 3: Duration. That this Executive Order shall expire upon the earlier of: (a) the Declaration ending; or (b) withdrawal of this Executive Order by the Village President.
